Undoubtedly the 2010 Annual Bike Ride was a glowing success. Led by Norm Clark, a team of 12 took off from Siem Reap for a gruelling ride covering 1200 kilometres over 8 days. I was fortunate to see the team finish at Kampuchea House, with decorations and posters made by the children to welcome the riders home. This was followed by a lunch with the children, before the brave-hearted got back on their bikes and headed into Siem Reap. Funds raised from the ride tipped \$53,000 which was made up from sponsorship, pledges, a cocktail party and other donations.

Finance: With efforts mentioned above and under the watchful eye of Martin, the last year has allowed further monies to be placed on term deposit. Details are tabled in the financial report.

Westbourne Grammar has again contributed tremendous support from the students and staff. This year also marked the retirement of Principal – Geoff Ryan, who has always been most supportive. We wish Geoff well in his retirement.

Welfare: As tabled in the Director's report, the educational transcripts of the children have been pleasing. It is fair to say they are progressing at an above average rate overall.

Two of the older girls, Sophary and Duong, have graduated their hospitality courses at Paul Dubrelle International School and have secured employment. Peach has finished hairdressing, and will hopefully gain employment in the near future.
